

One of the stars of Australian fiction, **Monica McInerney** is the author of the internationally bestselling novels, *A Taste for It*, *Upside Down Inside Out*, *Spin the Bottle*, *The Alphabet Sisters*, *Family Baggage*, *Odd One Out*, *Those Faraday Girls*, *At Home with the Templetons* and *Lola's Secret*. *The House of Memories* is her 10th novel. She is published worldwide and in more than 10 languages.

Monica, 47, grew up in a family of seven children in the Clare Valley wine region of South Australia, where her father was the railway stationmaster and her mother worked in the local library. Since then **Monica** has lived all around Australia, Ireland and in London and also travelled widely.

She was a book publicist for ten years, working in Ireland and Australia and promoting authors such as Roald Dahl, Tim Winton, Edna O'Brien and Max Fatchen and events such as the Dublin International Writers' Festival.

For the past twenty years, **Monica** and her Irish husband have been moving between Ireland and Australia. They currently live in Dublin.
